One Day Seminar on "Drug Development and Regulatory Process"-Interaction with Pfizer R&D Team, 21st July, 2018

One day interactive session on "**Drug Development and Regulatory Process**" by the R&D team of Pfizer Health Care India Pvt Ltd was organized in the college on 21st July, 2018. Dr. Paneer Selvam Balaji, Manager, Formulations, Mr. Kishore Chittimalli, Research Executive, R&D and Mr. Chinna Kumar, Research Executive, R&D were the speakers. Dr. P. K. Lakshmi, Professor, Department of Pharmaceutics, introduced the speakers. The program was inaugurated by the speakers and Dr. B. Madhava Reddy, Principal of the college. He welcomed the guests and explained the students about the objectives and the importance of the program.
